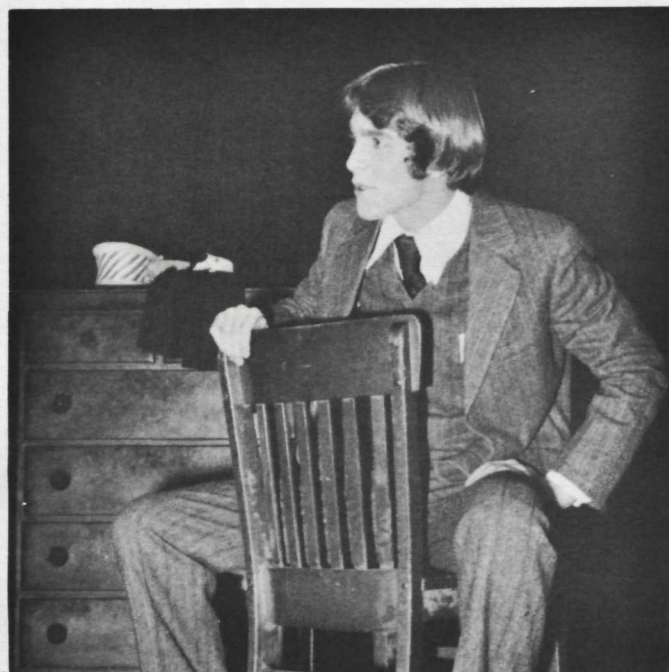
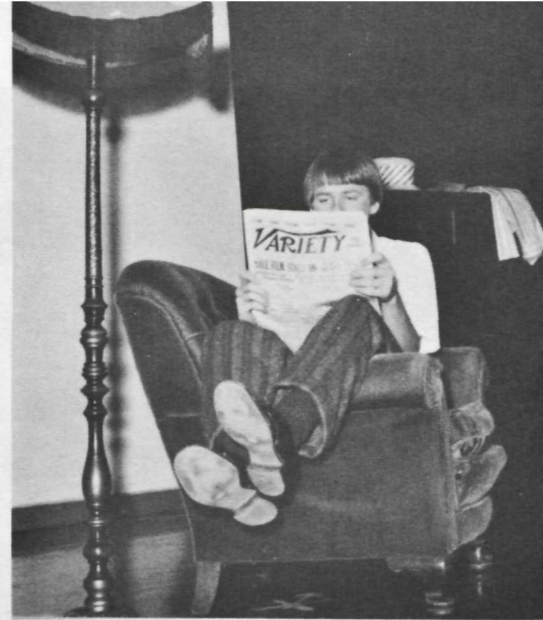


ONCE IN A LIFETIME
