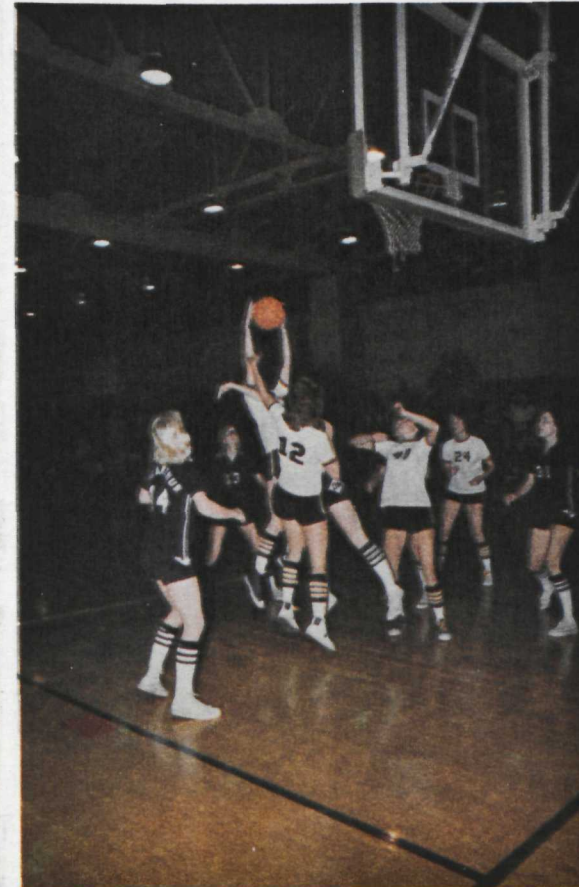


## Girls Varsity Basketball, Best Season Ever: 16-4
